Peter's Story

Peter served in the Royal Canadian Air Force as a mechanical engineer. After facing a series of personal and financial hardships, he found himself living out of his car. This temporary solution soon became unsafe and unsustainable, especially for a senior in his 80s.

Roughly a year ago, Peter connected with the Service Officer at his local Branch, who recognized he needed more than just a short-term fix. Through that connection, Peter was referred to our Veteran Homelessness Program.

It took time and months of collaboration between our team, local partners, and community resources, but slowly Peter's path began to shift. With help from our program, we secured permanent housing for him. Today, he lives safely, independently, and is supported by a network of all around care that includes food, medical assistance, and ongoing check-ins from our team.
